

Palmetto Code of Ordinances, Chapter 5, Amusements, Article I, In General, Section 5-3 Definitions; Section 5-4, Prohibited Acts, (a) and (b): Section 5-5 Public Nuisances; and Section 5-8 Enforcement; Chapter 16. Health And Sanitation, Article II, Nuisances, Section 16-26 Definitions;

Section 16-26(12); and Section 16-27(a), (b) & (c).

As the Respondents were present, this case was heard first. Mr. Leonard opened the Public Hearing. Mr. Strollo reviewed the codes violated, and read into the record the Noise Ordinance and Chapter 16, Article 2, Nuisances, of the Palmetto Code of Ordinances. He also reviewed the history of the noise complaints received through the police department. A Code Enforcement citation was issued to club manager Mario Valle on October 1, 2009, and to David Scalisi, one of the business owners, on October 15, 2009, and both individuals were found guilty in the Manatee County Court on December 2, 2009. A subsequent citation was filed on December 28, 2009 in the Manatee County Court and to date is uncontested. Due to Code Enforcement Board Minutes January 26, 2010 Page 2 of 4

continuing noise disturbances and numerous complaints, the Respondent was scheduled for this Code Enforcement Board hearing.

Mr. Strollo informed the Board that residents of Colonial Mobile Manor, Sonny and Tenna Hagan, wished to testify, and that owners David Scalisi and Michael Plechy were present at the hearing.

Mr. Hagan asked why the police have to ask The Hall to turn down the volume. They should turn down the volume and leave it that way. He said that Wednesday through Sunday from 8:00 p.m. to 3:00 a.m. you can hear the music. Mrs. Hagan said they can feel the music through their bed. They both still work.

Mr. Strollo interjected that in both of the citation cases, the officers confirmed that the noise was coming from The Hall.

In answer to Mr. DeVito's question, Mr. Hagan said all they are hearing is the base; not the music.

David Scalisi and Michael Plechy, co-owners of The Hall, were present to speak on behalf of The Hall. Mr. Scalisi said police tell staff to turn the music down. This didn't come to his attention until September. He has put a lock control on the volume. What they learned in court from the judge was that base can travel for miles. Based on engineering studies, it was found that the base travels underground. They have retained a sound engineer to help with the base speakers. They plan to raise the speakers off the floor, and that should eliminate the noise traveling. They are working to rectify the problem.

Mr. Rickey asked why, with so many complaints, they don't turn down the volume to a level where they know the noise won't travel. Mr. Plechy said moving the speakers should solve the problem.

Mr. Scalesi commented that DJ's will be financially responsible for any fines in the future.

Mr. Strollo presented his recommendation.

Motion to find the Respondents in violation of the City of Palmetto Code of Ordinances as read into the record on January 26, 2010; to order the Respondents to limit the volume of music and noise created and allowed from this property; to assess costs incurred in the prosecution of the case in the amount of \$391.80, plus any applicable recording fees; to schedule a hearing on February 23. 2010 to determine if the Respondents continue to comply with this order; and, to authorize the Chairman to sign the completed Administrative Order.

It is vacant and a foreclosure is pending. The Respondents have filed for bankruptcy, so the banks cannot remediate the violations. Code Enforcement is performing security checks of vacant property and making sure they're locked up to prevent vagrants and vandalism. This property was checked on January 5, 2010. Debris and

an abandoned vehicle were found on the property. A Notice of Violation was issued on January 7, 2010. Mr. Strollo recommends the Respondents be found in violation and a daily fine imposed. Mr. Strollo informed the Board that the Respondents now have different addresses. He made his recommendations, and Mr. Leonard closed the hearing for deliberation.
