Dear Mayor Bryant:

We want to thank you and the City Commission for reappointing our firm as City Attorney to the City of Palmetto. We look forward to working with you, the City Commission and the City staff to provide any legal services required by the City. Additionally, we will strive to provide proactive lawyering as much as possible to reduce potential litigation.

As you are aware, we have been successful in minimizing the potential for major litigation over the last two years. We have been working on a number of significant issues for the City, including a new Comprehensive Plan, land development code changes, coordination of the Palmetto Ball Field matters and numerous CRA initiatives. We have also worked on a variety of other matters such as the code enforcement and demolition matters, alcoholic beverages, abandoned housing and attainable housing ordinances, and revisions to the Personnel Policy and the sign code. Additionally, we now assist the CRA Advisory Board among other items not originally contemplated by our original agreement.

Our proposed rates represent a slight decrease in the amount paid under the City budget during the last two fiscal years. Because of increased work with the CRA, there is a small increase in the amount of funds contributed by the CRA. It remains below the amount charged by our predecessors in at least the prior five years.

For general representation, the firm will bill the City as follows:

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For the period from November 1, 2010 until the end of the day of the first organizational meeting after the 2012 general election:

The sum of \$18,333.00 per month (\$220,000.00 per year) which shall be paid by the City on a monthly basis, due and payable within 14 days of receipt of such invoice (with the invoice prepared the 16th of the month to the 15th of the next month) without the need for further invoice.

The general representation for the sums described above will include all attorney and staff time for non-litigation matters, as well as associated costs incurred by the firm except for extraordinary expenses such as filing fees, out-of-County travel, computerized legal research and the like consistent with our RFP.

As we have discussed, our firm has experienced trial attorneys who can handle most litigation matters that may arise. For such matters involving pending and active litigation and administrative proceeding outside of the City's internal administrative processes, the City will be invoiced separately and will be billed at the rate of \$225.00 per hour for shareholders, \$200.00 per hour for all attorneys with at least 3 years of experience, \$175.00 per hour for attorneys with less than 3 years experience, and \$95.00 per hour for clerks and paralegals. When appropriate due to the need for very specialized expertise, we will retain special counsel. Opinion letters to third parties will be negotiated with the Mayor based on the complexity of the issues and risks to the firm. The firm has ongoing matters with the City related to the School Board for which the firm serves as Special Counsel; including the agreements and purchases related to relocating of Palmetto Elementary and matters related to school concurrency. These matters are not adversarial at present, but in the event a conflict arises, we may need to retain outside counsel related to such matters. If at anytime during the term of this agreement, other City Appointed Officers' salaries are increased, then the firm's monthly billing amount and rates will increase an equivalent percentage to the average of any increase to the City Appointed Officers' salaries on or after October 1, 2012.

I will continue to be the attorney principally responsible for representing the City. However, we have attorneys specializing in a wide range of practice areas such as real estate, corporate, and tax law, many of whom are Board Certified, who will be available to assist when needed. Scott Rudacille of our office is also Board Certified in City, County

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and Local Government Law. Their services are included in the general representation fee discussed herein.

We strive to be open and available to our clients. We will promptly respond to your inquiries, usually within 24 hours unless circumstances prevent it. Our staff is well trained and knowledgeable. Progress information may be obtained from them, but they cannot give legal advice.
